

Government's Economic response plan

overnment has established an economic response plan with a view to support workers, stabilise businesses, ensure availability of strategic reserves and promote opportunities for economic diversification.

As a result, the Special Fund known as "COVID-19 Pandemic (Corona Virus) Relief Fund, has been established through the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development to deal with such.

The Fund provides financial resources to cater for the procurement of national relief supplies; evacuation cost for citizens outside Botswana; national publicity outreach programmes; relief of selected industries or sectors; public counselling centers or facilities; additional staff to support health professionals and an economic stimulus package post COVID-19 Pandemic.

All business sectors are eligible for the subsidy with the EXCEPTION of the following:

- a. Water Supply
- Businesses with direct Government shareholding in and Government aided entities such as NGOs
- b. Electricity Supply
- j. Central Government
- c. Wholesale Food
- k. Local Government
- d. Retail Food
- l. Pension administration services
- e. Post and Communications
- m. Stock exchange services

f. Banks

n. Fund management services

g. Insurance

- o. Medical aid fund services
- h.Parastatal Companies
- p. Health and pharmaceutical services

What conditions apply to the subsidy?

- i. Applicable only to citizen employees
- ii. Employers in identified sectors must be registered for tax with BURS
- iii. Employers must make a commitment not to retrench employees as a result of the pandemic
- iv. Applicant employer must produce a wage bill from December 2019
- v. The subsidy period commences in April and ends in June 2020



EMERGENCY POWERS (COVID-19) REGULATIONS 2020

A person who intentionally exposes another person to COVID-19 commits an offence and is liable to a fine not exceeding P100 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years, or to both.

Emergency Powers Act (Cap. 22:04)

A person shall not travel between villages, towns, cities and districts for noneessential travel during a lockdown.
