working on an Economic Stimulus Package that will be implemented post the COVID-19. "Allow me to take this opportunity to express my profound gratitude to all workers across Botswana for the significant contribution that they continue to make towards the socioeconomic development of this country. He said it was therefore important to create decent working conditions, decent jobs, to ensure security in the work place and provide social protection for families.

The President said it was disheartening that labour day was commemorated at a solemn moment when the impact on the global economy had been severe as the world was witnessing markets plunging to historic low levels.

He however expressed optismism that the battle against COVID-19 shall be won. # 8636 COVID-19 Tests Conducted in Botswana

The number of people who tested for COVID-19 in Botswana stands at 8636. According to an update from Botswana National Health lab, the first batch of tests were done on the 23rd of March 2020 and 3 positives cases including a death case were reported on the 30th of March 2020.

Of the 8636 tests conducted 8613 have tested negative and 23 tested positive of the deadly Virus while 8 recovery cases have been registered. The global cumulative number of confirmed cases as reported by Johns Hopkins University is currently at 3,500,552, with the United States of America continuing to register the highest number of new confirmed cases.

President Dr Mokgweetsi Masisi response to COVID-19, was to extend the national lockdown by one week starting from 1st May to 7th May 2020 and a further two weeks during which the lockdown would be sequentially eased. It is anticipated that final lockdown will be on the 22 of May 2020.

During the extension, the government will decide on a strategy to ease restrictions depending on how citizens follow guidelines designed to reduce the spread of coronavirus.

# <u>The Lockdown Extended in Phases</u>

#### Phase I

The current lockdown conditions period will be extend by one week, from May 1st to May 7th, 2020. During this period, The Government will also develop and finalize regulations for a phased lifting of lockdown rules in low risk sectors.

#### Phase II

Starting from May 8th to May 14th, Government, will lift in a phased manner, some lockdown rules while at the same time introducing additional plans for further lifting of the remaining lockdown rules.

#### Phase III

From May 15th to May 22nd, which will be the final week of the lockdown extension, Government will lift the remaining rules from the original lockdown rules implemented on March 30th, 2020.

### **Nurses Hailed For Their Dedication**

resident of the Botswana Nurses Union (BONU) Obonolo Rahube has hailed all health workers for their continued dedication to their profession.

Speaking in the event of the Workers Day he said "it is not surprising that during Labour Day we find ourselves working because that's the nature of our job."

Mr Rahube indicated that this year's Labour Day was to be celebrated under the theme 'End Covid19 and gear towards Botswana's economic independence' is totally different as it finds the world engulfed in Covid-19 pandemic.

"This was supposed to be a day to remember and efforts we put in daily at work but we find ourselves having to triple our efforts in the fight against Covid-19."

# Reminder

It is important for the public to remember that when someone coughs or sneezes, they spray small liquid droplets from their nose or mouth which may contain the virus. 
