LEA trade through digital channels

ocal Enterprise Agency's Chief Executive Officer has said the advent of the 4th Industrial Revolution has introduced business disruption as a strategy for market entry and penetration. Dr Racious Moatshe said the COVID-19 pandemic has however brought about disruption on a scale that is unprecedented.

He said at the end of March 2020, LEA conducted a snap survey to assess the impact of COVID-19 on LEA registered SMMES across the LEA branches countrywide. According to the CEO, the survey covered 382 enterprises, and revealed the following notable highlights;

- 63% of businesses surveyed had suspended operations, with an average

reduction in monthly revenue of 47%. The 382 enterprises have 2,669 employees, with a total wage bill of P5.9 million.

- The tourism sector, which accounts for 27% of the jobs in the survey, bore the brunt of the impact, with a 72% revenue loss in March 2020, which put 729 jobs at risk.

The 142 (37%) enterprises that remained operational faced challenges that jeopardised their viability. The challenges included amongst others challenges in importing raw materials, reduced revenue due to COVID-19 related restrictions and inability to pay fixed costs (salaries, rentals, loans etc).

Dr Moatshe said it is imperative for enterprises to trade through digital



channels in order to remain relevant in the 4IR. He revealed that LEA is working towards availing access to online resources tailored towards building SMMEs capabilities, with focus on business continuity and to assist with business recovery.

On the overall, in order to leapfrog and leverage on ICT as a business enabler, LEA has partnered with stakeholder institutions to collectively explore value chain opportunities for digitization and online trading platforms for producers to link with the retailers and other sources of markets with the plan being to pilot with the horticultural produce.

The Lockdown Extended in Phases

Phase I

The current lockdown conditions period will be extend by one week, from May 1st to May 7th, 2020. During this period, The Government will also develop and finalize regulations for a phased lifting of lockdown rules in low risk sectors.

Phase II


Starting from May 8th to May 14th, Government, will lift in a phased manner, some lockdown rules while at the same time introducing additional plans for further lifting of the remaining lockdown rules.

Phase III

From May 15th to May 22nd, which will be the final week of the lockdown extension, Government will lift the remaining rules from the original lockdown rules implemented on March 30th, 2020.

South Africa ease restrictions



South African Minister of Trade and Industry Ebrahim Patel says around 1.5 million workers in selected industries returned to work yesterday. The Southern African country gradually eased its strict covid-19 lockdown on Friday the 1st.

The lockdown which kicked started on the 27th March 2020 to contain the spread of the virus had serious economic factors. Upon realizing that the country was plunging into deeper economic turmoil, President Cyril Ramaphosa took a decision to categorically ease lockdown restrictions in an endeavor to balance between the economy and public health.

South Africa's lockdown took five weeks having registered 6,783 confirmed cases, 131 deaths and 2,549 recoveries.
