



The Lockdown Extended in Phases

Phase I

The current lockdown conditions period will be extend by one week, from May 1st to May 7th, 2020. During this period, The Government will also develop and finalize regulations for a phased lifting of lockdown rules in low risk sectors.

Phase II

Starting from May 8th to May 14th, Government, will lift in a phased manner, some lockdown rules while at the same time introducing additional plans for further lifting of the remaining lockdown rules.

Phase III

From May 15th to May 22nd, which will be the final week of the lockdown extension, Government will lift the remaining rules from the original lockdown rules implemented on March 30th, 2020.

The amended COVID-19 emergency power regulations

From 8th May 2020 until 20th May 2020

- i) Businesses and schools may operate provided that the Director of Health Services is satisfied that such institutions have the capacity to take body temperatures of all persons accessing the business or school
- ii) There should be regular disinfecting of business, trade or school premises
- iii) Upon direction of the Director of Health Services, business, trade or school may be closed in case there is reasonable suspicion that the person who has accessed such may have had contact with a COVID-19 positive person.
- iv) Parents or guardians have the responsibility to ensure that a child at pre-primary, primary and secondary schools is wearing a face mask.
- v) The Director of Health Services has been given the discretion, in consultation with the Ministry responsible for Tertiary Education, to direct the opening of schools in a phased manner, and under such conditions as the Director may specify.
- vi). During this period, people may move between cities, towns, villages and districts to attend a funeral of an immediate member of the family or access ranches, gardens, masimo and meraka, provided they are issued with a permit.
- vii) However, during this period, no liquor outlets and tobacco business shall be allowed to operate until further notice.

From 21st May 2020 until end of the State of Public Emergency

- i) For the purpose of preventing, controlling or containing the spread of COVID-19, the country has been divided into COVID-19 Zones. During this period a person shall only be required to have a permit when travelling across a COVID zone. Non-essential travel between COVID zones is discouraged.
- ii) It is mandatory for businesses, churches and funeral hosts to keep a register of all individuals that access these premises for purposes of contact tracing. With regard to churches, they can hold one (1) service a week and shall not exceed ten (10) congregants.
- During the state of public emergency, traders will not be allowed to sell surgical masks to persons who are not in the medical profession
- This is meant to ensure that personnel involved in the fight against COVID-19 have sufficient supplies of Medical Grade Masks.

Dr Kwape confirms 1 more COVID-19 Recovery Case

The Minister of Health and Wellness Dr Lemogang Kwape announced yesterday that Botswana has registered one more recovery case.

The announcement which was made during the debate to affirm the Emergency Powers (COVID-19) Amendment No.4 Regulations 2020, means that recovery cases now stands at 9, while Active Cases of COVID-19 is 13.

Botswana has conducted 9,360 cases of COVID-19 while 9,337 of the Laboratory performed tests are negative.

Tertiary institutions resume classes next month



The Minister of Tertiary Education, Research, Science and Technology Dr Douglas Letsholathebe says a proposal has been made for tertiary institutions to resume classes early June. In his contribution during the special sitting of Parliament to affirm the Emergency Powers (COVID-19)
Amendment No.4 Regulations 2020, Dr Letsholathebe said his ministry was working around the clock to ensure institutions refurbished ablution facilities and installed water basins as well as sanitisers where students can wash their hands as required.

This, he said, was to guarantee a safe environment for students and to curb COVID-19 infection. He explained that social distancing protocols will also be observed in classrooms.

In March the Government decided that schools be closed until further notice. The decision to close schools as explained by President Dr Mokgweetsi Masisi back then, was not only necessitated by the need to maintain a social distance among pupils, but to
