Professor Mosepele said this on Botswana Television last night that recovered COVID-19 patients may experience short term effects and possible devastating long term effects that may affect one's immune system. Professor Mosepele said some of the post COVID-19 recovery ailments include dizziness, new headache, erratic heartbeat, impaired memory, and sensitivity to light and sounds, extreme fatigue, excessive weight loss, brain fog, altered sleep pattern and high blood pressure amongst others.

The Deputy Coordinator said with these new complications, the healthcare system will experience a burden because the system has to battle with COVID-19 and other diseases and ailments which have been existing.

He said in the coming days, the Presidential COVID-19 Task Force Team will share more information on the topic, including the assistance of recovered COVID-19 patients.

Professor Mosepele further reminded the public that together we can defeat this pandemic through strict adherence to COVID-19 protocols such as washing hands with clean water soap, using sanitizer, social distancing, avoiding crowds and wearing masks when in public or with group of people.



No Scientific Evidence That Coronavirus Cannot Survive in summer - Prof Mosepele.

Presidential COVID-19 Task Force Deputy National Coordinator Prof. Mosepele Mosepele says Batswana should brace themselves for a summer season with influenza.

Speaking during a media briefing last night, Prof. Mosepele said the scientific experts are yet to determine the exact relationship between seasonal change and the spread of COVID-19.


He said there was school of thought that suggested the disease spreads faster in periods of lower temperatures during winter however the pandemic has proven otherwise.

Professor Mosepele said when COVID-19 started, there was a narrative that it will wane during the summer season because most flu viral illnesses seem to slow in the summer months. *To Page 3*

He however said contrary to that believe COVID -19 has proven otherwise as it is still ravaging countries that are in the summer season.

Professor Mosepele said it is currently hot in the United States of America however the country is experiencing the second wave of the deadly virus.

He said countries such as Germany, France, New Zealand and other European countries are in last days of summer but still experience a surge in cases.

The Deputy Coordinator therefore urged Batswana to be vigilant and guard against COVID-19 by abiding by the regulations. He encouraged people to wash hands with clean water and soap, properly wear a face mask and to avoid unnecessary crowds as well as practicing social distancing.

He said so far Botswana has conducted over 106 - thousand COVID-19 tests of which 603 are Batswana who are COVID-19 positive and 959 are COVID-19 positive foreigners tested at ports of entry. Professor Mosepele said there are currently 401 active cases in Botswana while 199 have recovered and 3 have unfortunately passed on.

Italy registers 953 in 24Hrs



Italy has registered 953 new Covid-19 cases in the past 24 hours, according to the latest data from the Ministry of Civil Protection. In the past week, Italy has seen an increase of over 6000 cases, the highest since the period of May 11-17.

The country has had a total of 260,298 cases and 35,441 deaths. The Italian intensive care units are currently treating 65 Covid-19 patients, 6 less than yesterday. CNN



KNOW YOUR ZONES

Extreme Social Distancing ended on 20th May 2020 signaling the end of the three phases which were introduced to curb the spread of the virus in the country. The Presidential Task Force has developed a survellance plan to monitor the disease. This resulted in the different zones to create cohorts for easier monitoring, easier tracing of contacts of positive cases and to avoid uncontrollable spread across the country.

The Inter-Zonal permit is therefore a requirement for people to travel from one zone to the other. Thirteen law enforcement check points have been designated across the country to monitor movements of people.

The nine (9) COVID -19 Zones are as follows;

- 1. Greater Gaborone zone
- 2. Greater Palapye zone
- 3. Greater Selibe Phikwe Zone
- 4. Greater Francistown
- 5. Boteti zone
- 6. Chobe zone
- 7. Maun zone
- 8. Gantsi zone
- 9. Kgalagadi zone
